Clinical Practice

- ***Seniors respond to depression treatment at home:*** A pilot program for delivering behavioral health services to seniors and their caregivers at home and in the patient's primary language has been shown to reduce rates and severity of depression and anxiety, and improve overall quality of life, according to recently released preliminary results. The initiative, known as Insights, is part of the Independence at Home (IAH) community service of SCAN, a not-for-profit Medicare health plan based in Long Beach, Calif. Insights began providing services to address depression, anxiety and related behavioral health conditions in seniors and caregivers in early 2016. Program services are provided at no cost to health plan members. Participants in the program must be at least 55 years old and reside in Los Angeles or Orange County, Calif. As of this month, 273 seniors have been referred to Insights by community-based programs, local medical groups and other IAH programs, and 172 have enrolled. - ***Congressional Briefing Showcases Unique Mental Health Treatments for Military Members:*** The Congressional Mental Health Caucus collaborated with the Military Mental Health Caucus to host a briefing showcasing specialized treatment options for active military members and veterans. The panelists included providers from the National Intrepid Center of Excellence (NICoE) at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center, dog trainers from the Warrior Canine Connection, and a bipartisan group of Congressional Representatives. - ***Capitol Hill Briefing Examines How IMD Rule Restricts Addiction Treatment:*** The Treatment Communities of America, in cooperation with the Bipartisan Heroin Task Force and the Addiction, Treatment and Recovery Caucus, held a Congressional staff briefing on the Medicaid Institute of Mental Diseases (IMD) Exclusion, its impact on addiction and recovery services, and necessary steps to address the issue. The IMD exclusion, established in 1965, prohibits Medicaid from paying for residential treatment for mental health and substance use disorders (SUDs) in facilities of 16 beds or more. As a result of the policy, capacity for residential addiction treatment has been limited. The briefing emphasized the importance of greater resource allocation towards addiction and recovery services, as only 18% of clients who need treatment for SUDs receive it per the National Institute on Drug Abuse.
