Description: Peer-led interventions are demonstrating they can increase activation for self-management of chronic physical and behavioral health conditions. Join this webinar to explore promising evidence from a Chronic Disease Self-Management Program adapted to peer intervention for people with SMI. Review a Health Center program serving homeless individuals where previously homeless Peer staff are key to Street Medicine Teams building trust and engagement with clients. Delve into peer staff roles, including teaching self-management skills, coordinating safe housing, and organizing links to community providers and resources. Participants will receive several resources and tools developed by Resources for Integrated Care (RIC) on how to support the efforts of behavioral health peer providers as they expand their capacity to deliver integrated and coordinated care to those individuals they serve.

Description: SAMHSA's 2015 National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH) yielded data from self-identified sexual minority respondents for the first time in the survey's history. While the data findings represent only a year of information, they indicate a critical need to better understand the relationship between sexual orientation and behavioral health. This webinar will highlight these key results from the 2015 NSDUH, complimented with corresponding practices from three organizations that serve LGBT individuals and communities: Fenway Health in Boston; Rainbow Heights Club in Brooklyn; **and the Montrose Center in Houston.**

EHRs, Security, and IT

- ***NQF maps out measures for interoperability:*** The National Quality Forum has moved closer to finalizing a framework for measuring interoperability. NQF says the framework will help identify in the nation's progress to enable widespread health data exchange. The agency's initiative comes as hospitals and electronic health records vendors are struggling with interoperability and the Office of the National Coordinator for Health IT is working to advance standards that enable information sharing. "Interoperability is more than EHR to EHR, and all sources of data should be taken into consideration," NQF said. "All critical data elements should be included in the analysis of measures as interoperability increases access to information." To that end, NQF based its work on ONC's shared nationwide interoperability roadmap to measure information exchange happening in four domains: disparate systems, data to facilitate information sharing, interoperability to enable decision making and, broadly, the impact interoperability can have on healthcare outcomes. Description: Federal, state, and private payers are rapidly shifting from fee-for-service models to value-based payment (VBP) models, which reward organizations for high quality outcomes and efficiency of care. The road to VBP models requires operational, financial, clinical, and workforce changes that can be difficult to navigate, with many challenges unique to child-service providers. Join this webinar to hear an overview of VBP models, common technical assistance needed and available resources to help organizations successfully make this transition.

- ***New Report on Effects of Premiums and Cost Sharing on Low-Income Populations:*** A new issue brief from the Kaiser Family Foundation reviews research showing the effects of premiums and cost sharing on low-income populations enrolled in Medicaid and the Children’s Health Insurance Program (CHIP). Among the key findings in the report are: 1.) premiums serve as a barrier to obtaining and maintaining Medicaid and CHIP coverage; 2.) even relatively small levels of cost sharing in the range of \$1 to \$5 are associated with reduced use of care, including necessary services; and 3.) state savings from premiums and cost sharing in Medicaid and CHIP are limited. - ***National Behavioral Health Barometer Now Available:*** SAMHSA is pleased to announce the release of the Behavioral Health Barometer, United States, Volume 4. Topics addressed in the report include substance use, serious mental illness, serious thoughts of suicide, and behavioral health treatment. The barometer uses data from the National Survey on Drug Use and Health and the National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services and presents findings by age, gender, racial and ethnic categories, poverty status, and health insurance status. Description: Quality crisis care is a proven approach for suicide prevention, but how do organizations know if they are providing the best services possible? In order to provide the most effective crisis services, it is important to identify gaps and strategize how to fill them. In this webinar, attendees will hear from two leaders elevating the field of crisis response. Content will focus on the Crisis Now Assessment Framework v1.2 Update and the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline’s Crisis Contact Center Metrics project. The updated Framework enables states and regions to quickly assess crisis care readiness, aligning services with industry standards and the four modern principles of suicide care: focus on safety/security, suicide care best practices, trauma-informed recovery model, and a significant role for peers. The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline will present efforts to establish best practices for key performance metrics for service, quality, and efficiency in the crisis center context. They will also highlight how agencies can utilize these metrics for improvement. Whether your organization has a robust continuous quality improvement program or you’ve just started assessing your services, this webinar will help all attendees better understand how their agency can promote best practices, elevating the standards of crisis care throughout the country.
